
We found our inspiration from a 5 minute mention of an evidence based prevention story, here, last year...

What are Resources?

Resources include anything a community can use to help address prevention needs, such as: People (for example, staff and volunteers) Specialized knowledge and skills (for example, research expertise) Community connections (for example, access to population groups) Concrete supplies (for example, money, and equipment) Community awareness of prevention needs Existing efforts to meet those needs.

What is Readiness?

Readiness is the degree to which a community is willing and prepared to address prevention needs. Factors that affect readiness include:

- Knowledge of the substance use problem
- Existing efforts to address the problem
- Availability of local resources
- Support of local leaders
- Community attitudes toward the problem





5 Tips for teaching tolerance in kids.


- 1. Model it.

Working with our Elementary School with older Middle and High School students presenting the material, kids teaching kids positive messaging and skills...











The Application Process

- ☐ Use a Word Processing Document
- ☐ Usually a 100 word max. per question
- ☐ The application site can time out
- ☐ Your application is 25% of your score at the Spring Youth Forum.

- ☐ Watch for email, after you completed and submitted your application.
- □ NOW, Register for the SYF, once selected!
- ☐ Presentation Day! Usually Mid-May at the Great Wolf Lodge
