Who We Are

- Publicly funded state university
- Approx. 26,000 students and 2,100 faculty
- Culturally diverse student body
- Approximately 15% of students report severe alcohol problems
- 25% of students drank more than 4 drinks in a sitting in the past thirty days

The Problem in the Nation


According to a survey by the National Institute of Health:

- 60% of college students have consumed alcohol in the past month
- ²/₃ of those students engaged in binge drinking
- 20% meet the criteria for alcohol use disorder

Overall alcohol use is going down but those that are drinking are engaging in high risk or binge drinking.



Alcohol consumption among college students over the past decade has remained relatively unchanged.










The Problem at Stony Brook

CONSEQUENCES OF COLLEGE DRINKING

Consequences for college students (ages 18-24) due to alcohol use per year

1,825 Deaths	400,000 Unsafe sexual encounters	599,000 Injuries
696,000 Assaults	97,000 Sexual abuse incidents	4.86 million Drunk driving incidents



Alcohol and Academics

- About 25 percent of college students report academic consequences of their drinking
- Relationship between alcohol, sleepiness, and GPA exists in college.
- Heavy drinking associated with lower GPA, Frequency of binge drinking associated with lower grades in college setting.







Bystander Intervention





Red Watch Band

Red Watch Band is a bystander intervention training designed to prevent death and other harms associated with high risk alcohol use.

The mission of Red Watch Band is to provide campus community members with the knowledge, awareness and skills to prevent toxic drinking deaths and to promote a student culture of kindness, responsibility, compassion and respect.







Goal of Red Watch Band


To prevent deaths and other harm caused by alcohol overdose. In order to do that, participants will gain the knowledge and skills needed to understand:

- How alcohol affects our physiology and behavior
- How to recognize an alcohol-related medical emergency
- How to respond appropriately and in accordance with university policies/procedures



Weekly interaction log completed to gain a better understanding of the types of conversations CARE Team members were having with their peers.











Created by one of our CARE Team members. One group got trained and then challenged other groups to complete the RWB training as a team.











Seen Informational Messages About Student Drinking or Drug Use on Campus






Reported from 2017 OASAS Grant Survey, n=720
