- Convenience sample (not generalizable)

- 35 of 39 counties
- Nearly 66,000 students



## COVID-19 Survey Questions

- Student demographics (11 questions)
- Physical activity and screen time (5 questions)
- School experiences (14 questions)
- Substance use (9 questions)
- Health and safety (14 questions)
- Connectedness and loneliness (2 questions)
- Changes in health behavior (3 questions)
- COVID-19 stressors and decisions (5 questions)
- Open-ended question for students to write anything else that they need help with from their school or community

## Results: Substance Use

## Substance Use

| During the past 30 days | Middle School | High School |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Smoked cigarettes | $0.7 \%$ | $1.7 \%$ |
| Used e-cigarette/JUUL/vape pen | $2.0 \%$ | $7.3 \%$ |
| Drank alcohol | $1.8 \%$ | $7.7 \%$ |
| Used marijuana | $1.4 \%$ | $7.9 \%$ |

## Mental Health \& Substance Use Disparities

- Prolonged feelings of sadness and hopelessness were most common among LGBTQ+ youth, those identifying as having a disability, and those from migratory working families
- LGBTQ+ youth and those that identify as having a disability reported having seriously considered suicide in the past 12 months more frequently than their peers
- Overall, past 30-day substance use was more common among LGBTQ+ youth, those identifying as having a disability, and those from a migratory working family
