




PTTC Regional Map



The Value of Credentialing

- Quality care requires a competent workforce that is well trained, educated, and skilled in providing appropriate services.
- Certification ensures that services are provided in an appropriate and ethical manner.
- The CPS certification has reciprocity with all other member certifying bodies of the IC&RC (International Certification & Reciprocity Consortium) that offer this credential.

Identify Growth Areas

- Education: What classes, training, books, articles, webinars, and other formal educational resources can help you build knowledge?
- Exposure: Find people who already have the skills or knowledge that you're trying to gain and learn them from. This could be through mentoring, informational interviews, or tapping into your network of close contacts or loose connections.
- Experience: Put yourself in positions or situations where you can gain experience in your development areas.¹

Foundational Trainings

- PREVENTION ETHICS: This course explores the six principles of the Prevention Code of Ethics and introduces a decision-making process to help practitioners apply this code to a variety of ethical dilemmas.
- ADVANCED ETHICS: In-depth exploration of the role of ethics in prevention work; applying the Prevention Think Tank's Code of Ethics' six key principles to more complex ethical situations.
- SAPST: Introduces the fundamentals of substance misuse prevention based on current knowledge and practice in the field.
- PREVENTION CORE COMPENTICIES: Covers the foundations of substance use prevention science for early and mid-career prevention professionals. Utilizes evidence-based strategies for adult learning; and builds upon and complements existing workforce training curricula/resources.

Mentors

Mentees

Newer professionals would have a dedicated resource to help them strategize for long-term career development and increase their working knowledge of the prevention field so they can become a CPS.

New England PTTC Project ECHO®

- Project ECHO (Extension for Community Health Outcomes)
- Evidence-based distance learning method in which a group of faculty experts meets regularly with a participant cohort to engage in case-based discussion and learning.
- 9-month program
- Each session includes a brief expert-led educational segment and an extended participant-led case discussion.




